classes for 10 years and lecturing for 6 years. Her husband, Mark, also participates in the lecture. He brings a quilted maple mandolin that he carved, and plays and sings a song in each lecture. He has also done much of the drafting of the quilts.

Mercantile Table:

All members may sell items at the mercantile table. It does not have to be quilting related but you must submit a list of items to be sold. The list must contain a description of each item, the price requested, your name and member number. In the case of books you may list them as follows. (i.e. 5 paperback books at 50 cent each., 1 yd blue fabric \$3.00) Each quilting book should be listed individually by title. On each item place your member number and the price requested. Please not use pins to attach the labels. Use an adhesive label or adhesive dot, pins can hurt. Be sure your list matches the items submitted. If you are going to sell several yards of different fabric and/or fat quarters, it would be helpful if you could place them in a shoebox or something like a shoebox. I need it to be easy to keep members items together. The Guild receives ten percent (10%) of all member sales. If you wish to donate items for sale just bring them and give to either Cheryl or Betty. No list is required, all proceeds go to the Guild. All items that do not sell after 2 or 3 months will be donated to one of the organizations in town (i.e. Rescue Mission or Arch) **Note: I have done the Mercantile table several times in the past and a major issue has been members trying to look and buy before the table is ready to go. It is very difficult to set the tables up and try to sell items at the same time, so this year I would like to try something. It is my intention to be at the meeting by 9 am and Mercantile ready to go by 9:30. I am requesting that all members refrain from coming to the table until I make an announcement mercantile is open. This will be greatly appreciated. The above instructions were suppose to be in January Newsletter, but I missed the dead line.**
