No Secrets or Cover-ups

Most people do not know the principles by which Christians live. They likely have heard the word "God" and may have a crude idea of what it means, but they do not really know who God is or what he is like. They probably have heard of Christianity, but likely their opinion of it is based on flawed information. They have perhaps heard of Jesus, but they really do not know much about him. Thus, the basic principles of Christian living are, in effect, secret.

This is not some kind of unknowable secret, or a secret that is intentionally kept hidden from all but a select few. It is available, but most people just do not know it.

There is no grand scheme to delude people in the name of Christianity. There are no back room shenanigans in which certain ones have managed to hide incriminating and embarrassing information about Jesus or the church. It is true that there are churches that have used underhanded methods and have tried to hide unethical behaviors. But that is not the Lord's church. Unethical or underhanded behavior is the outcome of people choosing a path contrary to the Lord's design. The truth about Jesus, the church, and Christianity is available.

There are at least two reasons why this ought to be mentioned. Occasionally someone will claim that he or she has discovered some great cover-up perpetrated by Christianity. Perhaps it has to do with an attempt to hide certain documents so that they cannot be a part of the Bible. Or, perhaps it has to do with some scandalous secret about Jesus which would change how people think about him. Such claims are not true. The truth about the Bible, Jesus, and his church are open to honest investigation. There has been no cover-up.

Some who claim to be Christians believe and practice things that Jesus never authorized. Thus, the image presented by them to unbelievers is a flawed image.

Here's the point of it all. We must do our best to present a correct picture of Jesus and his church to the world (Mt. 5:13-16; Jn. 13:34-35). Satan, the father of lies (Jn. 8:44), is working to present a flawed image to the world. Part of what this means for us is that that we must believe only what we can find taught in Scripture and that we live in keeping with true Christian principles (Jn. 8:31-32; Eph. 4:17-24). It also means that we do our best to introduce others to the truth about Jesus (Mt. 28:18-20).

Let us live so that Christianity is not a secret to those who are around us.


