Keep Silence!

“But the LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him” (Hab. 2:20).

Habakkuk was a prophet sent to the people of Judah to warn about their coming defeat by the Babylonians (1:6). They were going to fall because of their disobedience to God. Among other things, they were guilty of idolatry. Just prior to the above citation (2:20) is recorded the futility of idol worship (2:18-19). An idol cannot breathe, awake, arise, or teach. An idol is nothing more than the creation of the one who sculpts it.

In sharp contrast to that, the Lord is real. Habakkuk told the people of Judah that the LORD was in his holy temple (in Jerusalem). He was not on some metal-smith's workbench. He was not in some woodworker's clamp.

The point? God's people need to recognize him for who he really is. He deserves the utmost awe from all the earth. Let us bow in silence before our true and living God!

I must confess that I am a bit perplexed how anyone who reads the Bible can get the idea that church is unimportant – or that his or her involvement at church is unimportant. Jesus built the church (Mt. 16:18). The church belongs to Jesus (Mt. 16:18). Jesus is the head of the church, and the church is his body (Eph. 1:22-23). Jesus bought the church with his own blood (Acts 20:28). Jesus loves the church (Eph. 5:25). On top of all that, one is drawn to all those “one another” passages in the New Testament that indicate how important it is for us to be connected and involved. Consider a few of them:

Build up one another (Rom. 14:19).

Care for one another (1 Cor. 12:25).

Confess sins to one another (Jas. 5:16).

Pray for one another (Jas. 5:16).

Be kind to one another (Eph. 4:32).

Serve one another (Gal. 5:13).

Bear one another's burdens (Gal. 6:2).

Bear with one another (Eph. 4:2).

Forgive one another (Col. 3:12-13).

Encourage one another (1 Th. 4:18; 5:11).

Greet one another (Rom. 16:16; 1 Cor. 16:20; 2 Cor. 13:12; 1 Pet. 5:14).

Speak to one another in spiritual songs (Eph. 5:19).

Teach and admonish one another in spiritual songs (Col. 3:16).

Increase and abound in love for one another (1 Th. 3:12).

Always seek to do good to one another (1 Th. 5:15).

These ideas indicate that the church is important, and that I ought to be actively involved in it. My fellow Christians are important to me and I to them. We worship together, study together, pray together, work together, and fellowship together.
