

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## The Visually Handicapped Adults of the Valley Center

If you were to come by the VHAV, at 9:00 AM on Monday and Tuesday, you would see between 75 to 100 senior blind make their way precariously down the steps of vans. They then head to the warm dining room where they are greeted by happy volunteers, who give their time to make another day a little better, for someone whose life has been impacted by long days of bleak darkness. Later, they go from classroom to classroom, greeting their friends and the LA Unified School District teachers who are there to provide classes in ceramics, macramé, braille, current events, and mobility instruction. The Visually Handicapped Adults of the Valley even has a bowling team, and recently 13 of the students received an award from the Department of Recreation and Parks for outstanding bowling scores at the local Woodlake Bowl.

It takes a lot of nerve to leave your home when you're a visually impaired person. It takes a lot more when you are elderly and blind. However, the VHAV facility makes it possible for people who are blind to have the courage to get up, get dressed, and enter the world that is filled with light, though their steps are steps of darkness. As they enter the vans, they hear conversations and can only count on these verbal signals to maintain reality. All of this, combined with the efforts put forth by donors like you, makes these lives worth living every single day that the school is open.



# **Proposed Plan to Accelerate Research in Retinal Transplantation**

With significant reductions in federal funding to support research across this nation, even the well established scientists are spending more and more of their time seeking and generating support for their research. This focus has reduced the amount of time that they are able to spend in their laboratories doing what they do best: searching for solutions to fight the diseases that afflict us, our families and friends. One of the most tragic afflictions that impact the lives of the very young and old alike, is blindness.

Scientists are preparing to move to the next level in the research. Despite all of the advances, there is still much to be done.

#### **Proposed Solution**

In order to provide the environment in which these researchers can excel and expedite their scientific pursuits, RP International proposes to raise \$12 million dollars. 
