## They Are Not Offended

The studies have been done in a variety of ways, so there are a variety of statistics. Some studies suggest that 80% of first time church goers go because of a personal invitation from someone they know. 80%! Other studies suggest that more than half of all Americans were likely to go to church if they were invited by a family member or a friend. More than half!

Can we shift our thinking? Some in our culture – especially the loudest spoken ones – want us to assume that others are completely uninterested in our faith. Even more, they want us to believe that others are offended by our faith. Instead of assuming that those around us do NOT want to hear about our faith, can we train ourselves to assume that they DO want to hear about our faith? The studies are all in agreement on at least one point: our acquaintances are open to being invited to church. The closer the connection, the more likely the invitee is to attend. That does not mean everyone will say yes. It does seem to mean that they are not offended by your faith, and they do want you to invite them.

# Outline of Leviticus

David South

The theme is exemplified in 19:2 - "Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them, You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy." There are two points upon which the material in this document is based: how to become holy (1-10, 16) and how to stay holy (11-15, 17-27).

- I. Sacrifices (1-7).
  - A. This includes rules about various offerings: burnt (1), grain (2), peace (3), sin (4-5), and guilt (5-6).
  - B. It also includes rules for priests and offerings (6-7).
- II. Priesthood (8-10)
  - A. Consecration of Aaron and His Sons as Priests (8), and Aaron's Offering (9)
  - B. Death of Nadab and Abihu (10)
- III. Ceremonial Cleanness (11-15)
  - A. Clean and Unclean Animals (11)
  - B. Purification after Childbirth (12)
  - C. Leprosy (13-14)
  - D. Bodily Discharges (15)
- IV. Day of Atonement (16) – usually considered the most holy day in Israel. It was the only time in the year when fasting was required of all Israelites.
- V. Morality (17-22)
  - A. Venue for Sacrifices (17:1-9)
  - B. Eating Blood Forbidden (17:10-16)
  - C. Rules about Sex (18)
  - D. Love One's Neighbor (19:9-18)
  - E. Collection of Laws about Moral Living, including rules that were about being different from the people who lived in Canaan before them (19:19-37)
  - F. Child Sacrifice Forbidden (20:1-9)
  - G. Sexual Immorality (20:10-21)
  - H. Rules for Priests (21-22)
- VI. Religious Feasts and Special Days (23-25)
  - A. Three Feasts Required Gathering at the Tabernacle: Passover (23:4-8), Pentecost (23:15-21), and Booths (23:33-44)
  - B. Feast of Trumpets (23:23-25)
  - C. Day of Atonement (23:26-32)
  - D. Sabbatical Year – Every Seventh Year (25:1-7)
  - E. Jubilee Year – Every Fiftieth Year (25:8-55)
- VII. Blessing for Obedience, Curse for Disobedience (26)
- VIII. Vows (27)

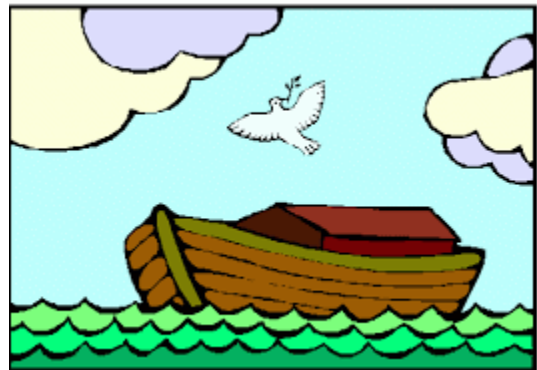
