“The Legendary Triangle”

This year's subject will explore triangle based quilts. I will have an extensive quilt collection for you to view and peruse while at the retreat. Traditional and non-traditional quilts will be shown. Must have basic quilting skills and knowledge.

Material List:

Sewing machine, basic sewing supplies, rotary cutter, mat and your favorite quilter's rulers.

Fabrics: Bring an array of fabrics you enjoy using and add some solids to the mix for use as background. Although a guessing game bring amounts you think will be sufficient to complete at least one project. Of course bring UFO's you wish to complete or any other projects you choose to work on.

Other items to bring:

Dress is casual, a sweater in the event it gets chilly and a quilt for show and tell. Your own linens: towels, sheets, pillow and blanket (or your quilt for Show and Tell).

Facility:

Ao-Wa-Kiya Camp is a smoke and alcohol free facility with heat/air conditioning and free Wi-Fi. It sits on beautiful Stony Lake, in Oceana County, MI. Canoes and kayaks are available for use. If there is enough interest the Zip Line can be implemented for an additional fee. Lake Michigan is minutes from the camp if one wishes to walk the magnificent sandy shore.

Each participant will have a six foot table to sew on. Design walls will be up for use as well as ironing tables. The sewing room faces the lake with large windows and great lighting. There is use of a microwave and refrigerator right in the sewing room as well as 24/7 coffee, tea, hot chocolate, water and ice. Breakfast (8:30 A.M.), lunch (12:30 P.M.) and dinner (5:30 P.M) are cafeteria style with the dining hall (Hearth Room) next to the sewing center.

Available Rooms:

2-3 participants to single room with twin beds and full bath.

Single room with queen bed/private bath - additional \$100 supplement (2 available first come basis.)

Cabin Thomas- dorm style sleeping is also available for overflow if needed or group of at least 2-6.

Cabin Thomas is located up a slight hill from the main sewing building. It is dorm style with twin and bunk beds. It is ideal for a group of two or more that want to be together. Participants without mobility issues are best suited for Cabin Thomas.
