Outline of Chronicles

David South

The books of 1 and 2 Chronicles were originally one book. (Like Samuel and Kings, it was probably divided when it was translated from Hebrew into Greek). Chronicles covers much of the same material covered by Samuel and Kings. It includes some details not included in the other documents. It appears to have been written with a slightly different goal in mind. Kings was written to explain to the captives why they were in exile, so it seems to emphasize the disobedience of God's people. Chronicles was written to encourage those who would return from the exile, so the focus seems to be on obedience to God and the temple. For example, Chronicles records the repentance of Manasseh, which is not included in the account of his wickedness in Kings (2 Chr. 33:12-17).

- I. 1 Chronicles, covers about 40 years, not counting the genealogies
 - A. Mainly genealogies (1-9)
 - B. Saul's death; David's reign begins (10-11)
 - C. Jerusalem is taken and becomes center (11-16)
 - D. God's covenant with David (17)
 - E. Some successes and failures of David (18-21)
 - F. David prepared for the building of the temple (22)
 - G. Divisions and duties of Levites and other officials (23-27)
 - H. Instructions/offerings for the temple (28-29)
 - I. David's death; Solomon's reign begins (29)
- II. 2 Chronicles, covers about 430 years
 - A. Solomon asked for wisdom (1)
 - B. Building and dedication of the temple (2-7).
 - C. Some of Solomon's accomplishments (expansion of the kingdom, praise from the queen of Sheba, great wealth) (8-9)
 - D. Solomon's death and Rehoboam's beginning (9:29-31)
 - E. Division of the kingdom (10)
 - F. The kings of Judah are described, along with the ups and downs of the kingdom of Judah. Israel is rarely mentioned. There seems to be emphasis on the kings who did right (11-35)
 - G. Decline of Judah and capture by Babylonia (36:1-21).
 - H. Order by Cyrus to return and rebuild after seventy years in captivity (36:22-23).
