Practice Makes Perfect

One has opined, “Practice makes perfect, but nobody’s perfect; so why practice?” Okay, that is a bit funny. But, something is wrong with it. Both statements are familiar to us. We have generally accepted both statements. So, what is wrong with putting them together this way? “Practice makes perfect” is a useful, easy to remember slogan. It is not intended to be absolutely true, however. The point is that practice will lead to improvement. Even though you will never reach “perfection,” you can improve.

“Nobody’s perfect” is intended in the sense that nobody is flawless. That is true. Jesus is the only one who lived a flawless life (cf. Heb. 4:15). It should never be used, however, as an excuse for not trying. It is possible that one would dismiss his or her moral misbehavior by remarking, “Well, nobody’s perfect.” God expects people to repent when they sin (Acts 17:30).

So, put your Christianity into practice (Heb. 5:14). You will not become flawless, but you will improve.

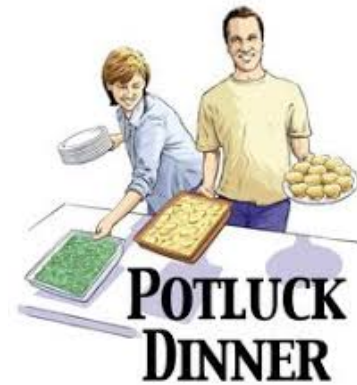

A couple weeks ago I was blessed to attend the Arise Mid-South evangelism conference hosted by Germantown Church of Christ, with Wes McAdams (McDermott Road Church of Christ) as the main speaker. It was a truly powerful and convicting weekend, and I thought I would share three of the main take-aways from my notes.

1) Evangelism is best motivated by gratitude, not guilt.

Maybe the first step to becoming better at spreading the good news is to count just how good it has been to you.

2) We share it not because it “works for us,” but because it is true.

God is real. Christ really lived, died, and was raised. The power and authority of the message lies in its reality.

3) The most compelling case for Christianity is (and has always been) a diverse group of Christians selflessly loving one another, loving their neighbors, and especially loving those who hate them.

No further comment necessary.

This week, I encourage us all to look at our hearts. Let's find the walls that keep us from being truly thankful, truly believing, and truly loving. And let's spend time in prayer asking God to tear down those walls, so we are ready to wholeheartedly spread the good news. May God bless you this week.
