Over-what?!

In an older edition of <u>Preacher Talk</u>, Cecil May, Jr. included the following item:

A brother declined an invitation to speak saying, "Thank you, but I have overcalendarized myself."

"Overcalendarized." What a great word for our current culture. We have become busier and busier. Demands on our time seem to keep increasing. There always seems to be something else to do or somewhere else to be or someone else to meet. As it turns out, much of that busyness is because we "overcalendarize" ourselves. Some demands on our time are unavoidable, put there by the necessities of life. Many of those demands, however, we put there ourselves – and often enough we do it without appreciating that we are overextending ourselves.

Remember Psalm 46:10, "Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!" Consider Psalm 145:5, "On the glorious splendor of your majesty, and on your wondrous works, I will meditate."

May we never so "overcalendarize" ourselves that we have no time for God and his business.

What's (Not) in the Bible?

On my ten minute commute to work, I sometimes listen to the radio. Once on the morning after Easter, the radio spokesman was bemoaning how much money Americans spent on candy, clothes, and toys for Easter. He then made the remark that people had forgotten what Easter was really all about. (Many make the same kind of remark about Christmas every year). He never really said what the point of Easter was, he merely griped that people had missed the point. He then qualified his remarks by saying, "If you follow the Bible. Not everyone follows the Bible. And that's okay, it's your choice."

Really? "If you follow the Bible?" I have to wonder if he has any idea what is actually IN the Bible. The celebration of Easter is not. (By the way, neither is the celebration of Christmas). This is not a diatribe against Easter and Christmas. (I enjoy both holidays). It is intended as a reminder that not everything is actually in the Bible that many people think is in there. It seems that if enough people say often enough that something is in the Bible, it becomes accepted as being in the Bible.

The events upon which these two major celebrations are based ARE in the Bible, and they are major biblical events. The birth of Jesus is unique. God took on flesh (Jn. 1:1, 14). This has only happened once ever. For one to understand the full significance of it would demand considerable effort at study and contemplation. The resurrection of Jesus is just as significant. Jesus was able to conquer death. Because of his resurrection, his people are assured of being raised to live with him (1 Cor. 15:12-23; 2 Cor. 4:14). So, the events are real, and they are recorded in the Bible. What is NOT recorded in the Bible is any instruction for a yearly celebration of those events. Christmas and Easter celebrations are human inventions. Perhaps those inventions came from sincere, devout motives, but they are human inventions nonetheless. They are NOT in the Bible.

So, what should you do? Let me suggest at least three things: 1) Remember that just because someone (even the preacher!) says something is in the Bible does not mean it is. 2) READ the Bible for yourself, so that you will know what is in it. After all, it is God's word given to us to instruct us how to live (2 Tim. 3:16-17). 3) When someone claims that something is in the Bible, find out WHERE in the Bible it is. Look it up for yourself to see if the Bible really says what someone claims it says. This is especially important when it comes to understanding what the Bible says about salvation.

I accept that Christians have the right to esteem one day above another (Rom. 14). It seems to me that the celebration of Christmas and Easter fit into that category, at least to some extent. What causes me to cringe is to hear people claim that these celebrations are in the Bible. I cringe even more, though, when I hear people teach salvation plans which cannot be found in the Bible. Such important truths demand that we each seek out exactly what the Bible says about salvation.
