

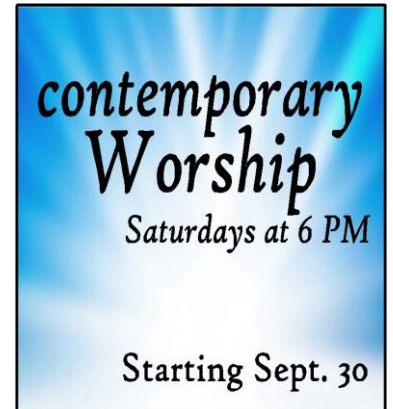

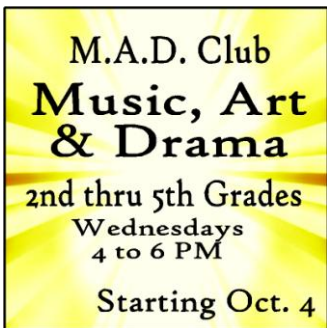

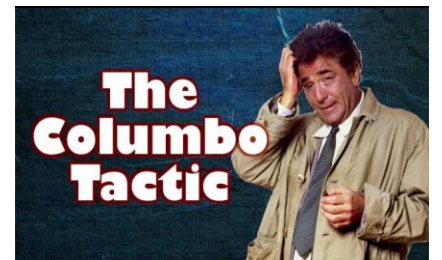
**M.A.D. Club Starts Again October 4

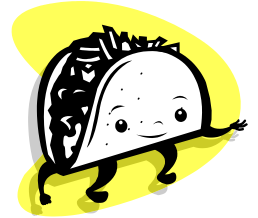
Quilt Club

- 100 – He was the first pastor to live in the current church parsonage. _____

- 400 – This local pastor, related to a local family, filled the pulpit when C. Elaine Smith had to move because of a family medical emergency. _____
- 500 – He was a cub scout master and helped build the present sanctuary. _____

Gender Gatherings

- 100 – The Women's group helped this couple extensively during hard times and were surprised to receive a sizable bequeath from them, which was used to build the fellowship hall. _____
- 200 – What is now called the United Methodist Women, has had many official names over the years. They were called this when the group was formed at our church in 1915. _____
- 300 – The United Methodist Men, first formed in 1950, were responsible for doing this to the Sunday school classrooms in the winter. _____
- 400 – The UMW bought this as a parting gift for Rev. Raymond Wilson for the cost of \$15, when he was moved from the church in 1939. _____
- 500 – The men of the church have held prayer breakfasts, Bible studies, and now meet Monday nights. In the past, they attending these men's conferences in Houston and San Antonio. _____

Youth Yearbook

- 100 – The youth have been going strong the last 25 years, but during the first 100 years, the church reports say they were on again, off again because of the lack of this. _____
- 200 – This youth found love, support, and a home in our youth group, and now serves our country in the U.S. Army. _____
- 300 – The youth summer mission trip started out traveling to the valley. In more recent years they have also traveled to these other five states. _____
- 400 – A 24 year tradition, the youth H.E.B spiritual retreat has been canceled only one time. It was cancelled for this reason. _____
- 500 – This youth lied about his age so he could work high on the scaffolding as the ceiling of the new sanctuary was being built. _____

- 100 – Our first church picnic of the modern era was hosted by this couple. _____
- 200 – This long running fall church activity was famous throughout Lytle. _____
- 300 – These two sports have been the centerpieces of church fellowship get-togethers. _____

- 500 – Lots of great church fellowship meals were served from the old church kitchen, which now serves this new purpose. _____

- 100 – Our newest missionary couple are spreading the gospel in this country. _____
- 200 – This Methodist church wide program, supported heavily by our church, was designed to help people in Africa deal with a deadly disease. _____
- 300 – The Aragon's, supported by our church, served with Mission Aviation Fellowship, and flew a plane in this country. _____
- 400 – Our church youth puppet ministry performed at this major San Antonio evangelism event. _____
- 500 – Bill and Diane Upchurch were missionaries supported by our church who served first in Africa, and then in South America. This church member first introduced them to our congregation. _____

- 200 – Our Vacation Bible School is known throughout the area for its quality, its large attendance, and its elaborate decorations, put together by these two ladies. _____

- 600 – Local pastor who donated land to the church for it to use to build and run a Lytle community cemetery. _____

- 600 – The children of the church often went to this place to sing during Sunday school. _____

Boundless Buildings

- 200 - Our newest building, our youth ministry building, was accomplished through the efforts of many and was named after this wonderful woman who loved the youth. _____
- 400 – This church building project was featured on the 2012 church directory. _____
- 600 – This was the nickname given to the workshop next to the church, which was purchased in 1997 and renovated by several church members. _____
- 800 – This nearby Methodist church helped start Lytle UMC, and merged with us in 1909 when the railroad bypassed their community. _____
- 1000 – The foundation posts for the first church sanctuary came from a farm owned by this very prominent local family. _____

Godly Encounters

- 200 – The people who attend this spiritual growth ministry aren't angry, but you wouldn't know it from its name. _____
- 400 – When Rev. Scott Martin started at Lytle, he traveled weekly to this woman's home to lead a Bible study. _____
- 600 – Irma Bayne has guided the music ministry of the church for 24 years. In 1994 she began taking the youth to this yearly musical event. _____
- 800 – The Walk to Emmaus has been a great source of spiritual renewal. A few people attended walks before joining the church, but this is the first person to attend from the church. _____
- 1000 – "Extensive improvement to our church in Lytle which we think will help us spiritually" were made in 1922. They included these added to the sides of the sanctuary. _____

- 200 – Youth leader Diana Jackson began this once-a-year local home rehabilitation project in November 1995. _____
- 400 – The church gives out over 240 Christmas presents a year through Project Hope/Angel Tree. Angel Tree children are identified through this national ministry. _____
- 600 – This local group, which is sponsored by our church and meets in the church youth building, has produced many soaring birds. _____
- 800 – Our food pantry has grown from its 1992 beginnings to its present large effective ministry. The property where it meets served this purpose before it was purchased. _____
- 1000 – The first adult mission trip of the modern era traveled to this community for this purpose.
