Checking balance: \$25,393.09

choir balance: \$7,866.66 (they still have two large outstanding bills, chocolate fund raiser and a costume charge, I think their balance will go down by \$3,000 by the end of the week.)

band balance: \$17,526.43 (we are still waiting to pay profitable solutions; that bill will be around \$7,750)
Our available is \$4,666.75: calculated by subtracting \$5,109.68 in student credits and anticipated fund-raiser bill.
